A few of the many examples of the practical action resulting from the partnerships between SVP and local communities include biodiversity havens from derelict land, parish land use and wildlife surveys, boosts to the local economy through the Stroud farmers' market, energy clubs that help members to save energy and money, homeowners installing their own solar water heating systems, and children learning about energy issues.

Established in 1988 by residents of Stroud, the charity continues to develop new projects that tackle the pressing environmental issues that most concern people.
